Pair and Share


Helping students share what they are learning about the Savior

HAVING ONE STUDENT SHARE WITH THE WHOLE CLASS IS POWERFUL, BUT ONLY ONE STUDENT CAN TALK AT A TIME. THIS LIMITS HOW MANY CAN SHARE.



PUTTING STUDENTS IN SMALL GROUPS AND HAVING THEM SHARE WITH EACH OTHER VASTLY INCREASES HOW MANY STUDENTS CAN PARTICIPATE.

1. ORGANIZE IT

GROUPS

- Be very clear about the size of group.
- Are they choosing their groups or are you?
- Be careful to make sure no one is left out.

STARTERS

- Assign a person to start the conversation.
- Get creative, don't always have the same starter, have fun with it!

TASKS

- Be crystal clear about what they need to share.
- You will probably need to repeat this a few times .

TIME

- Give them enough time for everyone to share.
- Give a 1-minute or 30-second warning so they can wrap up their thoughts.

"Get in groups of 2 or 3" "Pair up with 1 other person" "I'm going to put you in groups" "Hannah, will you be part of this group?"

"Oldest person starts" "Tallest person, you start" Person with the most siblings starts"

> "Share your thoughts on this quote" "What's your favorite part?" "Answer the question up on the board"

"You have 5 minutes to share your thoughts" "Keep sharing until 10:45" "You've got 1 minute left, start to wrap it up"



- While they are sharing, wander around and listen in.
- This will help groups stay on task.
- Listen for comments that need to be shared with the whole class.

3. CLASS SHARE

Many times you will want students share with the whole class after a pair and share. Keep in mind the following:

HONOR AGENCY

Talking in front of others is scary. Give a graceful way to bow out if they don't feel comfortable.

> "You're never going to forced to talk if you don't want to"

"If you don't feel comfortable sharing, say PASS"

VOLUNTEER

Set a clear expectation for sharing. This motivates people to share AND prevents too many sharers.

"I won't be able to call on everyone" "I need 3 comments on this one" "I'd love to hear from just 2 people" **VOLUN-TOLD**

There is nothing wrong with calling on people to share. Just make sure to honor agency.
